


Black bears are an important part of South Carolina's fauna. SC DNR is committed to ensuring the long-term wellbeing of the black bear, while addressing the property damage and safety concerns of residents. Wildlife biologists can provide technical advice to residents who live in bear country to help them take actions that will discourage bears from becoming a nuisance.



Black bears once roamed the entire state of South Carolina. Today there are two resident bear populations, one in the mountains/upper piedmont and along the northern coastal plain. Bears have been documented in all but 2 counties in SC. As human populations increase and development encroaches on bear habitat, encounters between bears and humans will continue to become more frequent.

**If a bear enters your yard there is information you should know.**

1. If you see a bear in or around your house you should go inside immediately and tell the first adult you see.
2. If the bear sees you:
  - DO NOT approach the bear,
  - Slowly walk away towards the building, and
  - Inform the nearest adult.
3. If the bear moves towards you:
  - Slowly back away towards the building while making noise,
  - Continues to tell the bear to GO AWAY,
  - DO NOT play dead or run away, and
  - Go inside the building and inform the nearest adult.



**How to keep bears out of your yard:**

- Keep all garbage inside an air tight container,
- Keep pet food put up, and
- In the spring and fall remove all bird feeders.



Answer Key: 1. TRUE, of the eight bear species, black bears are the only ones found in South Carolina. 2. FALSE, a male may have a range up to 10 miles. Female's range is normally only 4-5 miles. 3. FALSE, only about 20% of a black bear's diet is made up of meat and insects. The majority of a black bear's diet is made up of nuts and berries. 4. TRUE, bears are excellent climbers and climb trees when frightened or to search for food. 5. TRUE, it is illegal to entice a bear by any means in the State of South Carolina. This includes all attractants that may be found in one's yard. 6. TRUE, black bears have been documented in all but 3 counties in South Carolina. 7. TRUE, you should slowly walk away from a bear if you ever encounter a black bear. DO NOT run away or play dead. 8. FALSE, black bears are often attracted to an area by the scent of food.
