Guides and Maps

Paddling South Carolina - A Guide to Palmetto State River Trails –

The revised 2001 book by Gene Able and Jack Horan, published by Sandlapper Publishing, Inc. is a comprehensive guide to paddling most of the state's rivers. It is available at many bookstores, outfitter stores, and local libraries.

Canoe Kayak South Carolina - A Guide to Paddling the Palmetto State --

The 2014 book by Paul Ferguson, published by Pocosin Press is another comprehensive guide to rivers of South Carolina. See more information and useful online map features (Google Earth Placemarks) at the website - www.pocosinpress.com/indexSC.htm

South Carolina Atlas and Gazetteer (by DeLorme) --

This handy atlas has shaded relief maps for the whole state, with major and minor roads, lakes and waterways, boat ramps (not all ramps are shown), and more. A large-format (11x17), 60+-page atlas; it features 48 quad maps in a grid system covering the entire state. Available at many bookstores, newsstands, and on the Internet.

Topographic Maps by the US Geological Survey --

For detailed maps of rivers, the standard U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) topographic (topo) maps are a good choice. The 7.5 Minute (1:24,000-scale) map series offers the most detail. River travelers piece the maps together to get full coverage for areas of interest. To capture a larger area, a 1:100,000-scale topo is a good choice. Nautical Charts by NOAA, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration --
