AT 305 AM EDT WEATHER RADAR SHOWED A RAIN BAND APPROACHING UNION COUNTY IN UPSTATE COUNTY. THIS BAND WILL MOVE FROM THE EAST TOWARD THE WEST ACROSS THE COUNTY. THIS BAND IS PART OF THE RAIN BANDS ASSOCIATED WITH THE CENTRAL PART OF HURRICANE HUGO...ALTHOUGH THE CENTER OF THE STORM IS WELL TO THE SOUTHEAST OF UNION COUNTY. THE WIND IN THIS BAND IS LIKELY MUCH STRONGER THAN WINDS EXPERIENCED SO FAR IN THE UPSTATE... WITH GUSTS TO PERHAPS AS MUCH AS 70 MPH. VERY HEAVY RAINFALL WILL ALSO OCCUR WITH THE PASSAGE OF THIS BAND...AND PEOPLE SHOULD BE ALERT FOR THE POSSIBLE DEVELOPMENT OF ISOLATED TORNADOES IN THE STRONGEST RAIN BANDS. NO TORNADOES HAVE BEEN REPORTED IN THE UPSTATE SO FAR. WAJ

AT 440 AM EDT WEATHER RADAR SHOWED RAIN BANDS WITH HIGH WINDS ACROSS THE EASTERN HALF OF THE UPSTATE. TREES AND POWER LINES HAVE BEEN BLOWN DOWN OVER PARTS OF SPARTANBURG...UNION...AND CHEROKEE COUNTIES. IN CHEROKEE COUNTY THERE HAS BEEN A REPORT OF A MOBILE HOME BLOWN OVER BETWEEN GAFFNEY AND CHESNEE. IN GREENVILLE COUNTY...THE MAULDIN POLICE REPORTED TREES DOWN WITH POWER OUTAGES.

THE RADAR SHOWED A STRONG RAIN BAND ONCE AGAIN MOVING THROUGH UNION COUNTY...THIS SAME BAND WILL AFFECT CHEROKEE...LAURENS...AND POSSIBLY SPARTANBURG COUNTY WITH GUSTS AS HIGH AS 55 TO 65 MPH.
