THIS STATEMENT APPLIES TO RESIDENTS OF THE FOLLOWING SOUTH CAROLINA COUNTIES... BAMBERG... CALHOUN... CHESTERFIELD... CHESTER... CLARENDON... DARLINGTON... FAIRFIELD... FLORENCE... DILLON... LANCASTER... KERSHAW... LEE... LEXINGTON... MARION... MARLBORO... NEWBERRY... ORANGEBURG... RICHLAND... SALUDA... SUMTER... AND YORK.

HUGO HAS MOVED NORTHWARD OUT OF SOUTH CAROLINA..BUT SOME SHOWERS REMAIN OVER THE EXTREME NORTH CENTRAL PORTIONS OF THE STATE. WINDS ARE GRADUALLY DIMINISHING BUT ARE STILL GUSTING TO NEAR GALE FORCE AT SOME LOCATIONS.

PERSONS SHOULD CONTINUE TO EXERCISE CAUTION FOR THE STRONG WINDS UNTIL THEY DIMINISH BELOW GALE SPEEDS. REMEMBER TO STAY CLEAR OF DOWNED POWER LINES AND OTHER DAMAGED AREAS WHICH COULD BE A SAFETLY HAZARD.

PERSONS WHO EVACUATED FOR THE STORM SHOULD CHECK WITH EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS OFFICIALS BEFORE ATTEMPTING TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES. ROAD CONDITIONS AND THE EXTENT OF DAMAGE IN SOME AREAS MAY NOT YET PERMIT A SAFE RETURN.
