

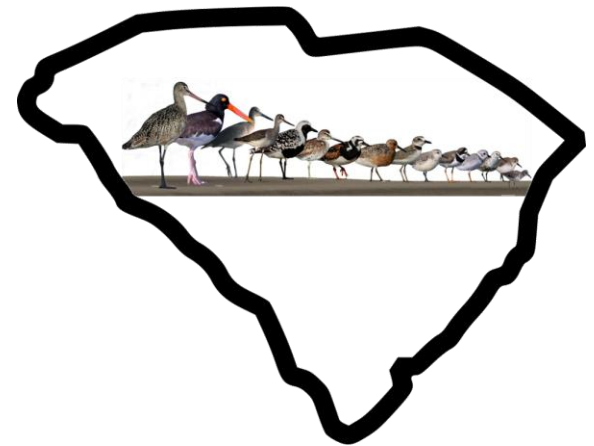
What is the SC Shorebird Project?

SCSP Increased Shorebird Conservation in SC!

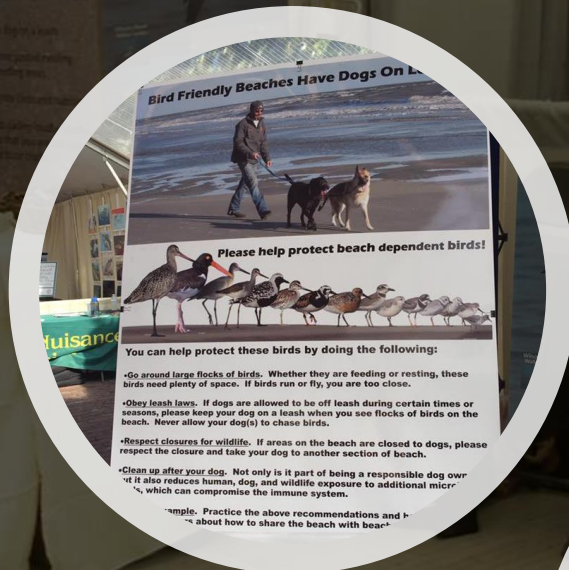
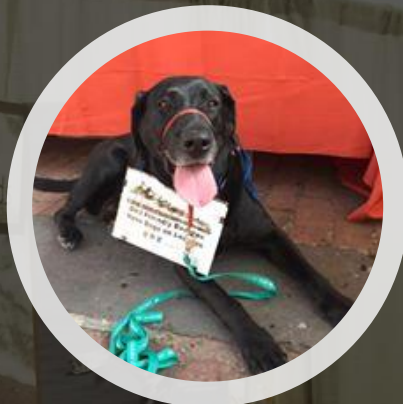
- Conducted PIPL migration & wintering surveys at 45 locations along SC coast, also counted WIPL, REKN, AMOY, and MAGO
- Conducted study of WIPL breeding habitat and preliminary state survey
- Designed and distributed outreach materials
- Increased protection of piping plover winter habitat and WIPL/LETE nesting areas
- Conducted two shorebird/seabird workshops
- First no dog areas established on State Park beaches



Save Shorebirds, Share the Beach

To Share the Beach with Shorebirds:

- Keep dogs leashed. They stress shorebirds and their nesting birds.
- Stay out of dunes. Dunes are a vital part of shorebird nesting habitat.
- Walk or hike around large rocks or logs on the beach, not through them.
- Avoid feeding birds or leaving food on the beach. Disturbance from humans and pets can cause stress and death to adults and chicks, so please:

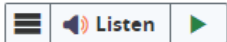

Spring brings the shorebird migration season. DNREC's [Delaware Shorebird Project](#) needs experienced and dedicated volunteers for the field season each spring.


To apply, please fill out the [Volunteer Information Form](#). New applicants should include a letter of interest briefly describing their experience and what they hope to gain by volunteering.

Experience and Duration

The Project needs volunteers with experience in bird capture, handling and banding, avian surveys and data collection. Less-experienced volunteers can be trained. Those who can commit to extended participation quickly gain the necessary experience to contribute to all aspects of the fieldwork.

Volunteers must contribute at least three days of service during the field season. The Project team works seven days a week. There is always something for volunteers to do.
